



RETURN TO PLAY PROTOCOL

UPDATED: OCTOBER 8th, 2020

The Keystone Centre has set forth the following rules to ensure the health and safety of our guests and staff. We are incorporating this Return to Play Protocol that will continue to enhance the guest experience and ensure safe participation in our facility. The health and safety of our employees and guests is our number one priority.

All users must adhere to the most current Provincial health order and Keystone Centre protocols. Deviation from the public health order of facility protocols may result in the group being asked to leave the facility immediately and future ice rental privileges could be suspended indefinitely.

FACE COVERING: The Keystone Centre requires spectators and participants to wear a mask or face covering while in the facility. Players may remove their face covering once in the dressing room. Spectators must have their face covered on at all times.

CAPACITY: As per Manitoba Health Guidelines we are currently restricted to 50 players and personnel on the ice surface and benches. This includes time keepers, coaches and players. Spectator capacity is based on 6ft social distancing in the bleachers of each arena and is limited to 58 persons. Social distancing decals have been placed on our bleachers indicating where people may sit. 6ft social distancing must be adhered to by all while in any area of the facility. Public washrooms are limited to 4 persons at a time.

TEAM SAFETY: Each team is responsible to dedicating one adult as a Compliance Officer to ensure that all facility and health department protocols are followed. This individual is responsible to monitor their affiliated team and their guests during their entire time in the building. This includes ensuring teams have completed a self assessment check prior to attending the facility, enforces all 'Return to Play' protocols and ensures dressing room spaces are cleaned and sanitized following their scheduled ice time.

HEALTH SCREENING: The responsibility of completing self assessments for player and parents will be with the teams dedicated Compliance Officer: <https://sharedhealthmb.ca/covid19/screening-tool/>

Employees and guests are instructed to stay home if they do not feel well and are instructed to contact a Manager if they notice a co-worker or guest with a prolonged cough, shortness of breath, or other known symptoms of COVID-19.

All staff and spectators are required to wear masks while at the Keystone Centre unless they are on the ice involved in programming. To further reduce the risk while on the ice, instructors and participants will be required to maintain an extended stick length distance from others as much as possible, excluding participants while they are actively engaged in hockey activity.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING & HAND SANITIZER: All employees and users must adhere to physical distancing guidelines by standing and sitting at least two metres away from other people throughout the facility. While on the ice, users must be an extended stick length away as much as possible. Distancing markers will be throughout the facility, located on floors and benches, indicating proper distancing. Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the facility. Dispensers will be located at entrance and exit points, as well as high-contact and high-traffic areas. When entering the facility all patrons are required to utilize the hand sanitizer.

FACILITY MAINTENANCE & SANITIZATION: The Keystone Centre will be thoroughly cleaning the dressing rooms following the completion of each day. Washrooms and common areas will be cleaned and sanitized on a regular basis daily. Teams are responsible to clean their dressing room before they depart. The Keystone Centre will not be supplying teams with sanitizing equipment.

ARRIVAL: Entry / Exit will be through Entrance B (Brandon Curling Club Doors). All are required to sanitize their hands upon entry. Participants will not be able to enter any of the Keystone Centre arenas surfaces until fifteen (15) minutes prior to the start of their session and must vacate the premises within fifteen (15) minutes after the session has concluded. All participants are strongly encouraged to come to the arena fully dressed for their game with the exception of helmets and skates, to minimize their time spent in high traffic areas.

DEPARTURE: All attendees and participants must vacate the facility immediately following their scheduled ice time. However, we understand some players may require assistance exiting the facility. When this is the case chaperones must wait outside the arenas in the designated player pick up zone and stand on the floor markers while practicing social distancing with others at all times.

SPECTATORS: At this time, we ask participants to limit their accompanied guests to ONE. It is mandatory that all guests who are not participating wear a mask while in the facility at all times. No standing on the glass or in the foyer will be permitted. Spectators are expected to maintain social distancing at all times when in the Keystone Centre.

DRESSING ROOMS: At this time access to dressing room areas is limited to fifteen (15) minutes before and after your scheduled ice time and you are asked to only use the area that you have been directed to. Washrooms will be available for users of the facility. Water fountains not be available to participants or spectators.

Access to the permanent dressing rooms is limited to 11 players and 2 coaches per room. The rooms will be assigned in advance and are clearly marked to ensure physical distancing while in the room.

Temporary Dressing rooms set in arena capacities are as follows:

KIN A – 9 PLAYERS

KIN B – 8 PLAYERS

KIN C – 18 PLAYERS

ENNS A – 8 PLAYERS

ENNS B – 8 PLAYERS

ENNS C – 18 PLAYERS

Players are able to access the dressing room space fifteen (15) minutes before their scheduled ice time however, participants are encouraged to come to the facility dressed for the ice. There will be no access to the dressing room showers. Washrooms and sinks will be permitted for use. These areas are not secure, so we ask that all valuables be kept at home.

Once you have put your skates on, you are asked to remain in your dressing room until your teams Compliance Officer escorts you and your team to the ice surface. Spectators should not enter the dressing rooms unless they are able to do so without surpassing the dressing room capacities. Chairs will be spaced in hallways outside dressing rooms in the event skate assistance is required.

Please refer to dressing room assignment board for assignments.

GENERAL RULES

To enhance physical distancing players should use the same entrance on and off the ice nearest to their dressing area. Dressing rooms or skate-tying areas will be allocated to help distance one group from another.

Maximum of one person per timekeeper box. Only exception will be for users who reside in the same household. Or both individuals are wearing a mask and equipped with hand sanitizer.

User groups are responsible for sanitizing any shared equipment between uses.

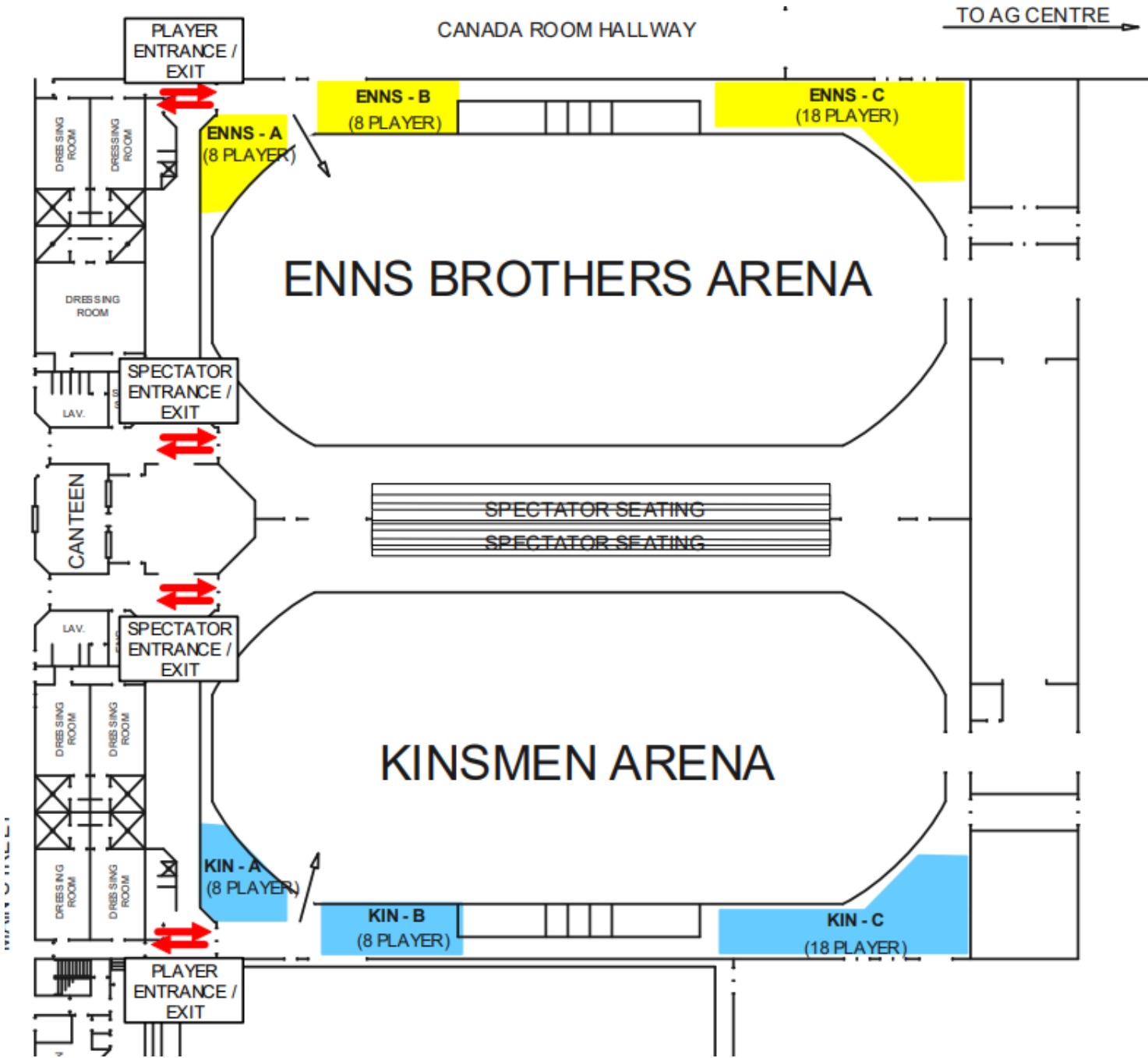
Absolutely no spitting or fighting at any time. A zero tolerance policy regarding spitting and fighting will be enforced and individuals may be asked to leave the premises and have future bookings suspended.

All users must bring their own labeled, pre-filled water bottle. Sharing of water bottled is prohibited and no water fountains are available for participants or spectators.

Physical contact for goal celebrations is prohibited, including hugging and high fiving. There will be no handshakes at the conclusion of a game or scrimmage.

Rosters must be provided for all facility bookings prior to access to the facility. Roster must include all participants, including coaches and referees. Rosters will be used to determine access to the facility.

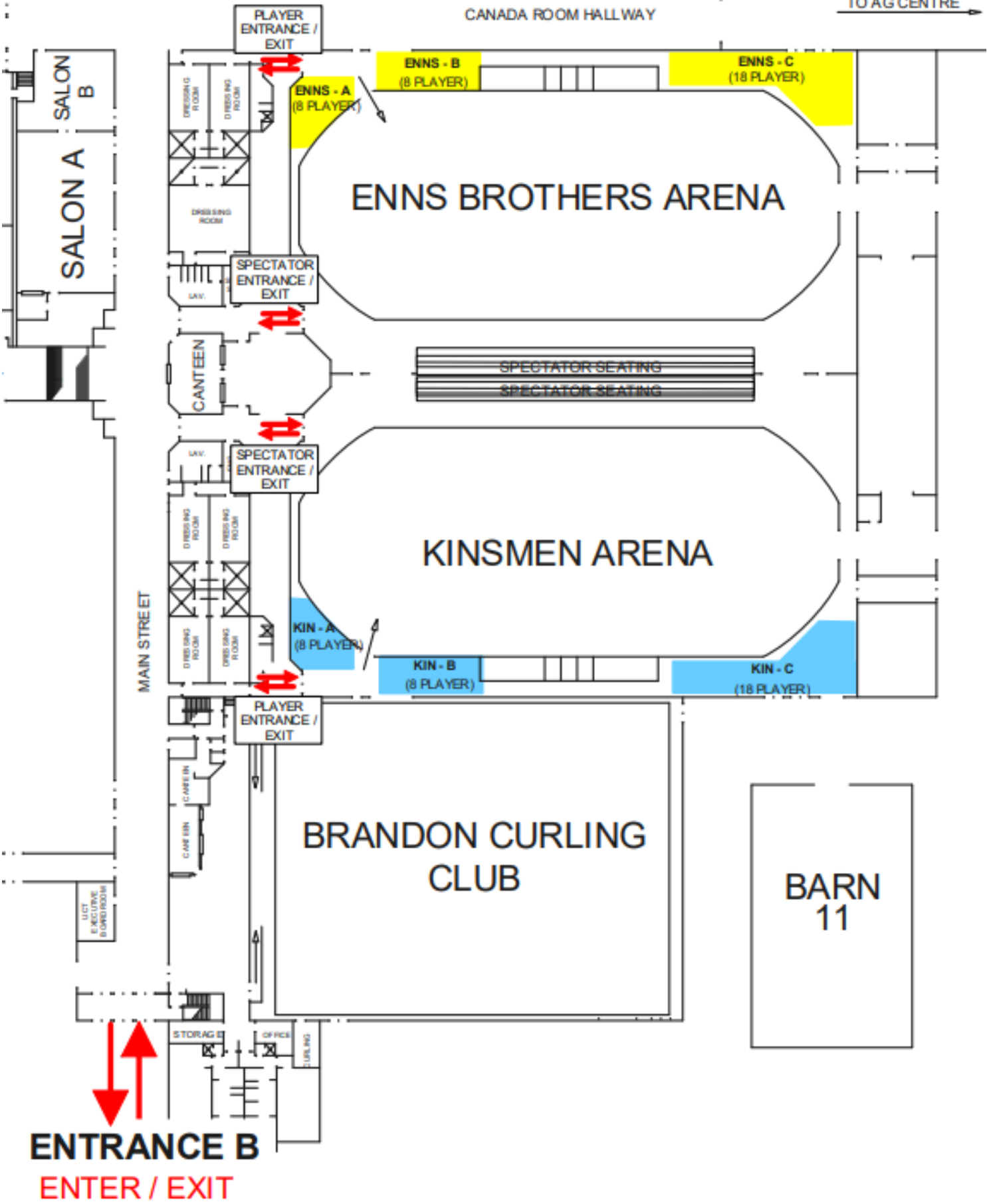
